How to discipline children according to the director general (DIRJEN non-formal and informal PAUD, 2011: 8) is with a positive approach, such as setting a good example, interacting frequently by telling stories, positive encouragement and support, rewards in the form of praise and gifts. Parent you should often interact with children, because with that the child will feel comfortable and will it is easy for children to receive something good from parents such as a good role model, encouragement to foster interest in learning, a sense of discipline in learning, and can maintain children's enthusiasm for learning. Children's literacy can be built if parents make literacy activities a habit in the family. Literacy habits provided by parents can predict children's reading ability and the quality of children's literacy competence in the future (Niklas et al., 2016). Literacy habits at home can be formed if parents are able to implement each of the activity programs in it properly and regularly. Shared book reading is probably the most studied aspect of literacy at home. Research

shows that the frequency of parent-led book reading is positively associated with children's oral language skills (Guo et al., 2021). Learning to read in the early years of education provides a foundation for later literacy development and academic success (Hamilton et al., 2016). The effects of shared reading were found to be important for oral language skills (vocabulary and listening comprehension) at all time points where these skills were measured (Silinskas et al., 2020).

The creation of a positive Home Literacy Environment (HLE) is certainly inseparable from several factors that support and hinder its provision. These factors can come from parents, children, and literacy facilities at home. First, parents should be actively involved in their children's literacy activities so that they can support and motivate their children in literacy activities. children in literacy activities, considering that early childhood is a child who still needs require assistance from adults so parents must remain involved in every activity their children do every activity carried out by the child. Parental involvement is important to support children's learning (Fatonah, 2020). Furthermore, it is stated that parental involvement is directly related to achievement and motivation. Therefore, the more parental involvement in assisting children's learning, the better the children's achievement and motivation in literacy. and motivation of children in literacy. Parental involvement is also closely related to the availability of time. time availability. Parents' work patterns may also limit their time to engage in reading activities with their children (Mascaren et al., 2014). Reading with their children (Mascarenhas et al., 2017). The more time provided, the more involvement they will provide. Some parents try to provide enough time for their children, but the consistency of time availability to provide literacy activities at home is also needed (Dimosthenous et al., 2017).

In addition, the level of knowledge parents' level of knowledge is also related. Parents who

- 5. Ensure a variety of books are available. Some can feature familiar environments such as in a house or in a park, and some can be about completely new places, such as on the moon!
- 6. Books with tabs and flaps help grab a young child's attention they will love the interaction, and lifting the flaps and pulling the tabs will help to develop their fine motor skills.
- 7. When reading a book to your toddler, ask them what they think will happen next. Stop at the end of a sentence and allow them to start the next sentence in the book.
- 8. Or you could try discussing the book beforehand, sharing ideas on what may happen in the story. Once you have read the story together, talk about what happened.
